VOYAGER TIPS AND TRICKS – UNIT STATUS

Are you aware that you can alert other officers to your status through Voyager? The **Status** feature provides an easy way for officers to provide key details to potentially dangerous situations. Using our **Status** feature provides instant updates to Headquarters or other officers.

Handheld version of Voyager,

- Select Unit Status from the main menu to pull up a drop down list.
- Click the correct options to indicate your status, which is instantly shared with all other users within your agency.
- From this screen, you can also view the statuses of other officers on duty.

Laptop and desktop users can also use this feature,


- Click the F7 hotkey located on the top of the screen.

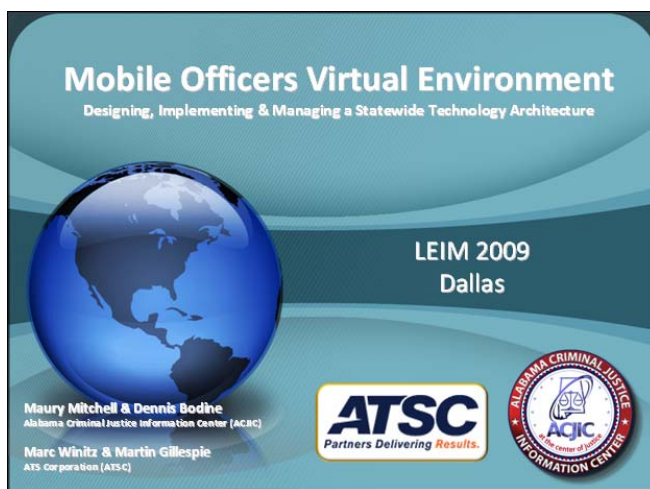

ATSC PRESENTS VOYAGER AT LEIM

ATSC and the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) presented an industry best practices presentation on implementing multi-agency CJIS data systems in wireless environments at LEIM. Held in Dallas, TX in May of this year, LEIM attracted 500 law enforcement technology executives from across the United States. ATSC Voyager plays a mission critical role providing ACJIC with the basis for supporting their statewide Mobile Office Virtual Environment (MOVE). MOVE is a suite of law enforcement productivity applications designed to be accessed in a mobile environment. ATSC Voyager provides multi-agency CJIS data access in a single sign on environment, as well as images, status capability and secure messaging for inter and intra agency interoperability. UPDATE ON ATSC VOYAGER FBI CJIS ADVANCED AUTHENTICATION REQUIREMENTS

According to the FBI CJIS Guidelines, "All mobile/remote devices, including all handheld and small form factor devices such as Personal Digital Assistants (PDAs), purchased after September 30, 2005 shall meet the approved form of data encryption and advanced authentication. All remote clients shall meet this requirement by September 30, 2010". In order to meet these guidelines ATSC Voyager has developed an FBI CJIS approved two factor authentication system for our customer base.

Unlike other vendors, ATSC Voyager will be providing this solution to all of our customers **free of charge**. Some of our states already have two factor advanced authentication enabled and are currently using it per FBI CJIS guidelines. For the states that are not enabled, ATSC will be converting all agencies over to this new process over the coming year.
