ATS AWARDED A SUBCONTRACT VALUED UP TO \$40 M BY PEROT SYSTEMS GOVERNMENT SERVICES, INC. (PEROT SYSTEMS), TO SUPPORT "EDUCATE."

MCLEAN, VA – November 7, 2007- ATS Corp. (OTCBB: ATCT.OB) has secured a ten-year subcontract from Perot Systems to provide support on the Department of Education's ("DoED") Education Department Utility for Communications, Application and Technology Environment (the "EDUCATE contract"). The recently awarded EDUCATE contract will support more than 5,200 users in the Washington, D.C. area and at 10 regional offices around the country.

The EDUCATE contract significantly expands the scope of the previous EDNet support services contract. Under EDUCATE, the Department of Education is migrating from a Government Owned, Contractor Operated ("GOCO") IT environment to a Contractor Owned, Contractor Operated ("COCO") managed services IT environment. The EDUCATE contract services include desktop support, helpdesk, e-mail, disaster recovery services, network, communication and multimedia services and printer services.

Under the terms of the subcontract agreement, ATS will provide the primary support for the Institute of Education Services ("IES")'s web development requirements, a Customs Application team responsible for operational, developmental, debugging and fine-tuning assistance to over 150 databases at DoED which support many departmental agencies, and Server Administration and Desktop Support Services.

ATS has provided a broad-base of IT operations and support services to the DoED CIO since 2000 under the EDNet Program – the predecessor contract to EDUCATE.

"This arrangement with Perot Systems allows our company to extend its long-term relationship with the Department of Education which began in 2000," said Shannon Brown, Senior Vice President of Advanced Technology Systems Corp. "This continues the ATSC tradition of partnering with our customers to establish long-term working relationships. We're delighted to be able to work with Perot Systems as they expand their partnership with the Department of Education."
